The Intendant further begs leave to suggest to the honourable the General Assembly, the propriety of having a public arsenal, and an armourer to take care of it; Frederick-town would be a secure place. At present the arms, accoutrements, &c. are dispersed, except those imported since the peace, which are in boxes and bales, and stored in Annapolis, and for the want of house room cannot be opened.

The Intendant begs leave to suggest to the General Assembly, the propriety of passing a law or resolution, allowing the collectors to receive the emission of the 8th of June 1780, (now reduced to a small sum) for such part of the taxes of 1784 and 1785 as are not appropriated to congress; the property for this emission being sold higher than any other in the state, and therefore humanity would dictate that the same indulgence ought to be given to those as to the other debtors of the state. There is not at this time the same necessity for so immediately calling out of circulation the continental state money, because its redemption is set at a more distant day.

Applications
