On progression in reading the said bill, the question was put, That the word "twelve" be struck out, and the word "six" inserted in the said bill? Resolved in the affirmative.

On progression in reading the said bill, the question was put, That the following clause be received as an amendment to the said bill? "And be it enacted, That if any warehouses to be appointed in virtue of this act shall happen to be burnt or otherwise destroyed (except by the negligence of the inspector or inspectors) the tobacco thereby destroyed shall be made good to the several persons injured thereby by an allowance on the journal of accounts at the next session of assembly after such loss; and in case of such accident, no inspector or inspectors shall be sued or molested by reason of any notes or receipts by them given for any tobacco burnt in the said warehouse, but shall be altogether acquitted and discharged of and from the payment of the tobacco in such notes or receipts mentioned, any thing in this act to the contrary notwithstanding?" The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. Dent appeared as follow:
