George Gale, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a petition from John Hamilton, agent for settling the accounts of the Maryland line, praying compensation for his services; a memorial from Walter Dulany, of the city of Annapolis, praying that an act may pass to entitle him to the privileges of citizenship; a memorial and representation from John Steret and company, of Baltimore town, setting forth, that on the 27th of July 1785, they were constituted by Nicholas and Jacob Vanstaphorits their attorneys and agents, and requiring, on behalf of the said Nicholas and Jacob Vanstaphorits, a compliance with the contract made the 1st of July 1782, between Matthew Ridley, Esq; agent for this state, and the said Nicholas and Jacob Vanstaphorits; a memorial from John Beale Bordley, William Paca, and Nathan Hammond, praying an act may pass, to confirm their titles in and to certain lands in the city of Annapolis, part of Bordley and Thomas Larkin; a petition from a number of the inhabitants of Baltimore and Harford counties, praying an act may pass to lay out a road from the bridge at Onion's Mills, over the mouth of the falls of Gun-powder river, commonly called the Long Calm, until it intersects the present post road near captain Skeritt's, and for building a bridge over the said falls; severally endorsed "By the senate, January 5, 1786: Read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.
