

F R I D A Y, February 24, 1786.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. F. Bowie. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Bond appeared in the house.

The bill for the relief of Robert Crawford of Baltimore county, confined in the gaol of the said county, was read the second time by especial order and passed. Sent to the senate by Mr. Steret.

Mr. Wheeler is excused for absenting himself without leave of the house.

On motion, ORDERED, That Mr. Carroll, Mr. Dent, and Mr. Joshua Seney, be a committee to prepare a message to the senate relative to the amendments proposed by them to the bill for the valuation of personal property within this state.

Mr. Dent, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following message:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, FEBRUARY 24, 1786.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONOURS,

THIS house have accepted all the amendments proposed by the senate, to the bill for the valuation of personal property within this state, except those in the 5th, 7th, 8th, and 13th lines of the thirteenth page, and those of the 2d, 3d, 4th, and last lines of the fourteenth page. We return the bill, hoping the senate will recede from those amendments.
