Your committee observe, that besides the specie actually paid into the continental treasury, this the hath advanced five months pay to the Maryland line, under the expectation of its being deducted from the specie requisitions, which amounts to 84,435-58 dollars, and which, if allowed, will by fo much leffen the balance in specie stated above.

That in the requisition of August, 1786, besides two years interest on the foreign loone, about

107,507 dollars, part of the principal of those loans are included in the quota affigued this state.

That the several requisitions include the interest from time to time on the foreign and domestic debts, and the interest of the foreign loans having been paid by an application of part of the principal of those loans and other resources, although the state is apparently debtor for interest of foreign loans on the requisitions, yet on payment of the money, it will be applied in discharge of other burthens.

That this state not having been able to comply with the circumstances required for islaing facilities and indents, the state is highly interested in adopting speedy and effectual measures for obtaining

its quota of continental paper securities.

Your committee have calculated the yearly interest on the foreign loans, including 11,18526, mentioned in the requisition of August, 1786, payable to foreign officers, &c. in Paris, and find one tenth thereof is about £. 16,780.

On a comparison of several estimates and requisitions of congress, your committee are of opinion, the federal domestic debt is about twenty-seven millions of dollars, one tenth-2,700,000 dollars. This state has liquidated continental loan-office certificates, 214,712

Your committee, on a comparison of several requisitions, observe, that the ordinary current expences of congress may be estimated not to exceed 450,000 dollars, one tenth being equal to f. 16,750; and that the ordinary yearly expence of the civil government of this flate, is estimated at about f. 16,000.
