THE committee to whom was referred the memorial of Johnsey Gaither, guardian to Ely Gaither, the youngest son of Edward Gaither, late of Montgomery county, deceased, beg leave to report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and find the facts therein stated to be true, and are of opinion that an act should pass, relinquishing the right of the state to the twenty-seven acres and three quarters of an acre of land mentioned in the said memorial, and vesting the right and property thereof in the said Ely Gaither, his heirs and assigns for ever, as it was the intention of the parties that the same should have passed by the deeds referred to by the memorialist. All which is submitted to the honourable house.
