RESOLVED, That the debtors to the state of Maryland, whose bonds, by the third section of the act, entitled, An act to establish funds to secure the payment of the state debt within fix years, and for the punctual payment of the annual interest thereon, passed at November session, one thousand feven hundred and eighty-four, were appropriated as an additional fund for the redemption of the emissions of June, one thousand seven hundred and eighty, may pay and discharge their respective debts and interests in the same manner that other debtors whose debts were consolidated by the said act and not fet apart for the purposes aforesaid may and can discharge their debts under the said act, provided they pay up, within three months from the passing of this resolution, all the interest which would now be payable under the faid act on their bonds if they had not been fet apart by the faid third fection, with all costs that hath accrued thereon.
