On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to settle and pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government. ORDERED, That Mr. Shaw, Mr. J. Worthington and Mr. Seney, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill respecting the securities of public debtors, and for other purposes. ORDERED, That Mr. Winder, Mr. W. Tilghman and Mr. Pinkney, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On the second reading of the bill to regulate the inspection of tobacco, (agreeably to the order of the day) the question was put, That the bill be amended by striking out the words "at the least remote distance from him," in the 5th line of the first clause? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. B. Worthington, appeared as follow:
