"And be it enacted, That no merchant, trader, retailer, or any other person, shall purchase any tobacco either in casks, boxes, or parcels of any fort, unless it shall have been previously inspected at some public warehouse, agreeably to the directions of this act, and any person so purchasing contrary to this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum of twenty dollars, to be recovered, on information, before a single justice of the peace of the county where the offence happens, for the use of the informer."
