The bill to enable certain commissioners to make partition of a tract or parcel of land called Bohemia Manor, lying in part within Cecil county, of this state, and part in Newcastle county, of the state of Delaware, and for other purposes therein mentioned, endorsed; "By the senate, December 7, 1789: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Amendments proposed. Strike out from the word "state," in the 13th line of the 1st page, to the word "deceased," in the 16th line of the same page, and insert "is entitled to one undivided moiety of the respective parts descended from his said father and the said Anne Bouchell, in common with the said Edward Oldham and Mary his wife, who are seized of the other moiety of the same in right of the said Mary, who is sister of the said idiot, and daughter of the said Joseph Enfor, deceased." After the words "to wit," in the 9th line of the 3d page, strike out to the end of the clause, and insert "as to such part thereof as lieth in this state, to be held by the said Joseph Enfor in severalty, and as to such part thereof as lieth in the state of Delaware, one moiety to be held by the said Joseph Enfor in severalty, and the other moiety to be held by the said Mary and Edward Oldham in right of the said Mary in severalty." At the end of the bill insert the following proviso: "And provided always, that this act shall not take effect until the consent of the said Peter Lawfon be first had in writing, and filed in the chancery court."

Which were read the first and second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Amendments proposed. After the words "original act," in the 5th line, insert "lying formerly within the temporary line of Pennsylvania, and now included within the limits of the state of Maryland." After the word "lands," in the 9th line, strike out the words "till the 10th day of May next, and insert "and included in the former act, until the twentieth day of March next, and against such persons as purchasers of such property so circumstanced, and intended to be relieved by this act, until the tenth day of June next." At the end of the bill add "and the same additional time is hereby given to any person or persons interested in the lands comprehended in this act to exhibit his or their petition to the chancellor, to obtain an investigation of their respective rights or titles, in the manner provided in the said original act, and according to the true intention thereof."

Which were read the first and second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
