thereof, hath been paid or fatisfied, and that he doth not know of any payment thereof being made to the faid John Ward Veazey, or to any other person for his use, and that he hath not himself received the same, or any part thereof, except so much as shall be credited on the said account; and if any citizen, of whom such arrearages or balances shall be claimed, shall allege that the same hath been paid to any agent or deputy of the said John Ward Veazey, it shall be lawful for the said Peter been paid to any agent or deputy of the said John Ward Veazey, it shall be lawful for the said Peter Lawson, or other person interested, to cause such agent or deputy to be summoned before a justice of the peace of such county, and to be examined, on oath, concerning the truth of such allegations; and the faid Peter Lawson is, by virtue of this act, allowed until the first day of October next for the purpose of making and completing his collection of the said arrearages and balances."

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act to dispose of the reserved lands westward of Fort Cum berland, in Washington county, and to fulfil the engagements made by this state to the officers and soldiers of the Maryland line in the service of the United States, endorsed; " By the senate, Decem-
