THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the more effectual punishment of criminals; the bill to restrain surveyors, to regulate certain proceedings in the land-office, and to compel the attendance of witnesses on surveys under the authority of the chancery, general, and county courts; the bill to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as require certain oaths to be taken by members of the general assembly, and electors of the senate; and the bill to authorise one justice of the peace to determine in case of final debts, and for other purposes therein mentioned; were sent to the senate by Mr. Ridgely, of William.

On motion, ORDERED, That Mr. W. Tilghman, Mr. Oneale and Mr. Quynn, be added to the committee on the representation of the visitors and governors of St. John's college.

On motion, the question was put, That the bill to repeal certain parts of an act, entitled, An act to prevent disabled and superannuated slaves being set free, or the manumission of slaves by any last will and testament, and of a supplementary act thereto, and for other purposes, now have a second reading? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. W. Bowie, appeared as follow:
