THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.
 The house appointed Henry Whetcroft and Elie Vallette committee clerks. ORDERED, That they be qualified.

Whereas it appears that Richard Dallam loaned to the state of Maryland the sum of four hundred dollars, under a resolve of the general assembly of this state, begun and held at the city of Annapolis on Friday the thirty-first day of October, seventeen hundred and seventy-seven, for which said sum so loaned the treasurer of the western shore granted, on behalf of this state, four several certificates, each for the sum of one hundred dollars, which said certificates were liquidated by the auditor-general agreeably to the act of May session, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, but the governor and council did not think themselves authorized to pass an order to the treasurer of the western shore for the payment of the same agreeably to the act aforesaid, they considering the time granted for bringing in such claims to have elapsed; therefore, RESOLVED, That the certificates aforesaid, liquidated and passed by the auditor-general, shall be laid before the governor and the council, who, after examination thereof, and correcting any error therein, may give an order on the treasurer of the western shore for the sum due, in specie, who shall give a certificate for the sum expressed in the order agreeably to the directions of the act of assembly passed at May session, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, entitled, An act to adjust the debts due from this state.
