That it appears to your committee, certificates, agreeably to the act to adjust the debts due from this state, have been issued to sundry persons to the amount of £. 1,233 3 8 $\frac{1}{2}$, and certificates agreeably to an act for the liquidation and payment of debts against persons convicted of treason, and British subjects, and the supplementary acts thereto, paid sundry claimants, amounting to £. 335 13 4.

That your committee have counted and burnt the sum of £. 92 0 0 in bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly of June 8th, 1780.

That your committee have also examined and cancelled certificates issued under the act of November, 1785, to the amount of £. 25 13 0; certificates for debts adjusted amounting to £. 8,137 7 4; certificates for continental certificates liquidated to amount of £. 11,115 2 8; depreciation certificates amounting to £. 6,938 4 11; certificates for debts against persons convicted of treason to the amount of £. 3,042 9 2; and the further sum of £. 56 18 3 in journal certificates.

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of said treasurer, he hath paid away from the 1st of November, 1790, to the 1st of November, 1791, £. 27,994 10 4 specie, 412,263 dollars and $\frac{64}{100}$ final settlement certificates, and £. 97,269 18 9 continental loan-office certificates and old continental money; for all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts; and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 422,576 dollars 87 cents six per cent. stock, 298,320 dollars 31 cents three per cent. stock, 252,139 dollars 77 cents deferred six per cent. stock, and £. 25,744 0 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ specie, which said sum of specie is appropriated in the following manner:

That it appears to your committee there is the sum of £. 8,850 0 0 in the treasury of the emission made by congress 18 March, 1780, it being part of the one tenth of the bills that became issuable in exchange for old continental money, and appropriated for the purpose of calling out of circulation the bills of credit emitted by acts of assembly, and resolves of convention, of this state.

That it also appears to your committee there is the sum of £. 3,484 9 4 of said bills remaining in the treasury, which was paid on account of British creditors.

All which is submitted to the consideration of the honourable house.
