On motion, ORDERED, That Mr. Mercer, Mr. Pinkney and Mr. Goldsbrough, be a committee to prepare a message to the senate, proposing a conference of a committee of both houses for the purpose of drawing a congratulatory address to the king and national assembly of France on the establishment of the peace and liberties of that country.

On the second reading the bill to empower the justices of Cæcil county to streighten and amend the public roads in said county, and to levy the expences attending the same on the assesseable property of said county, the question was put, That the following proviso be received as an amendment to the said bill? Provided always, that the road at present leading from the river Susquehanna by Charles-town to North-East, shall not be altered, streightened or amended, in such manner as to remove the said road from Charles-town, but any commissioners, to be appointed in virtue of this act, shall be bound to survey and lay out, and the said road shall be opened by Charles-town aforesaid.
