So it was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Goldborough, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act to revive and aid the proceedings of the orphans court of Dorchester county; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The amendments to the resolution respecting My Lady's Manor, were read the second time and rejected.

On motion, the question was put on the following, viz.

Whereas sundry debtors, in virtue of certain resolutions assented to by the general assembly of this state, discharged their bonds and accounts in final settlement certificates which had an interest due thereon previous to the first day of January, seventeen hundred and eighty-five, and the said resolutions authorised a payment of such bonds and accounts in final settlement certificates bearing an interest only from the said first day of January, and it is reasonable that the surplus interest should be allowed to them; therefore **RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to pay the amount of such surplus interest in three per cent. stock belonging to this state, after existing appropriations on such stock shall have been satisfied.

Amendments proposed. Strike out the words "regularly every day, Sundays excepted," interlined between the fourth and fifth lines, and after the word "kept" in the third line from the bottom, insert "so many days in each week, from nine o'clock in the forenoon till four o'clock in the afternoon, as the county courts of each county shall respectively appoint; which said courts are hereby authorised and directed to make such appointments at their first meeting after the passage of this act, and as often thereafter as occasion shall require." Strike out the proviso at the end of the bill.
