M O N D A Y, November 19, 1792.

THE house met: Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Ridgely, Mr. Nelson, Mr. Hutchings, Mr. Clark, Mr. Grahame, Mr. Bowie, Mr. O'Donnell, Mr. Threlkeld and Mr. Gibson. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Jeremiah Crabb, a delegate returned for Montgomery county, and Mr. Thomas Marsh Forman, a delegate returned for Cæcil county, appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking the oath to support the constitution of the United States, took their seats in the house.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to direct the mode of prosecution in certain cases. ORDERED, That Mr. Campbell, Mr. Duvall and Mr. M'Pheron, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

A petition from William Akers; counter to the petition of sundry inhabitants of Dorchester county, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee on the petition to which it is counter.

Petitions from Barton Baker and Edward Wheeler, of Montgomery county, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Montgomery county, praying that a road may be laid out from the line of the county, by Motton's and M'Cubbins's mills, and by Montgomery court-house to Frederick and George towns, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Crabb, Mr. Wootton and Mr. Oneale, to consider and report thereon.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to open and lay out certain roads from Denton, in Caroline county, to different parts of said county, and to appoint commissioners for the same. ORDERED, That Mr. Driver, Mr. Hughlett, Mr. Douglass, Mr. Loockerman and Mr. Duvall, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

A petition from William Jones and William Bradford, of Harford county, praying to be released from a debt due by them, as securities of a certain Francis Billingsley, to the state, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Oneale, Mr. Forman and Mr. Wootton, to consider and report thereon.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act for valuing the lot of ground in Upper-Marlborough, in Prince-George's county, on which the inspecting-house stands, and for paying the proprietor the value thereof. ORDERED, That Mr. Sprigg, Mr. Chapman and Mr. Quynn, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On the second reading the bill to increase the allowance to jurymen of the general courts, and the several county courts, in this state, the question was put, That each jurymen attending the county court be allowed 7/6 per day? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. Prall, appeared as follow:
