The bill to direct the mode of prosecution in certain cases, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate, with the bill to confirm an act to prohibit members of congress, or persons in office under the United States, from being eligible as members of the legislature or council, or holding offices in this state, by the clerk.

On the second reading the supplement to the act, entitled, An act to restrain surveyors, to regulate certain proceedings in the land-office, and to compel the attendance of witnesses on surveys under the authority of the chancery, general, and county courts, the question was put, That any deputy surveyor, who at the time of his appointment shall be seized of lands, may be authorized to take out a common or special warrant or warrants of resurvey on the land whereof he shall be so seized?
