THE senate have dissented to your resolution in savour of captain Waters, but would have no ob-GENTLEMEN, jection to passing a resolution, suspending (until the title of that part of his purchase made of the states claimed by the heirs of colonel Ryder, can be ascertained) the execution against him, on his paying for the land sold him, clear of dispute. The sum to be so paid by him, to be ascertained by deducting from the amount of his bond the value of that part of the land in dispute, and this value to be lettled by three persons, or any two of them, one to be appointed by the governor and council on behalf of the state, one by captain Waters, and these two to choose a third; and as there are
