Your committee are informed (although they are of opinion the powers under the said will are full and complete) that it is doubted by counsel eminent in the law, whether the find powers are sufficiently clear and plain. Your committee therefore propose, that a law pass to confirm the powers enabling the petitioner to fell, dispose and convey, the said estate. All which is submitted to the honourable house.
