M O N D A Y, December 10, 1792.

THE house met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Chapman, Mr. J. Ringgold and Mr. Bowie. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The resolution in favour of John Robertson, the bill for the benefit of William Charles Neill, the bill to lay out and open a road to and from the mills of Joshua Askew, on the main falls of Patapsco river, in Anne-Arundel county, the bill to dispose of the estate of William Cole, deceased, the bill to establish the road from Baltimore-town to Frederick-town, by Ellicott's upper mills, as a public road, and for other purposes therein mentioned, and the bill to open a road from Shoal's mill, now the property of John Hood, to intersect the main or turnpike road leading from Baltimore-town through Liberty-town, at or below the branch of Benjamin Bennett's, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, the question was put, That all private business before this house, not yet acted upon, be referred to the next session of assembly? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Dashiell, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On the second reading the bill respecting the militia, agreeably to the order of the day, the question was put, That each person appointed to take the lists of names in the several counties be allowed for his trouble at the rate of two dollars and two thirds of a dollar for every hundred persons so listed? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. Ridgely, of Wm. appeared as follow:
