A petition from the fociety of people called Quakers, with an address from the committee appointed by the said society, praying to be exempted from militia duty, was preserred, read, and referred to

the committee appointed to bring in a bill to regulate the militia.

A petition from fundry inhabitants of Kent and Queen-Anne's counties, stating, that the proprietors of lands adjoining the shores and waters of the bay, rivers and creeks, preclude them from fishing and fowling, which they conceive they are entitled to under the charter of this state, and praying relief, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Lloyd, Mr. Duvall, Mr. Dennis, Mr. Sprigg, Mr. Seney, Mr. Gordon and Mr. J. Wilmer, to confider and report thereon.

A petition from fundry inhabitants of Allegany county, praying an act may pass, empowering commissioners to lay out a road from Turkey Foot road, above the fork of Jenings's run, up the said run by Oswall's saw-mill, until it intersects Braddock's road, at the land of Robert Clarke, called the Mountain, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Simkins, Mr. Johnson and Mr. Bayard, to

confider and report thereon.
