THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

A petition from Joseph West Plummer, of Frederick county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred; read, and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

A petition from Nicholas Tice and George Buckhart, junior, of Frederick county, praying to be released from a debt due the state as securities of Adam Fisher, late sheriff of Frederick county, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Johnson, Mr. Bayly and Mr. W. Thomas, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Bennett Hurst, praying that he may be made good the damages sustained on the purchase of a tract of land, lying in the Reserves of Baltimore county, purchased of Daniel of St. Thomas Jenifer, late intendant of the revenue, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Ridgely, of Wm. Mr. Seney, Mr. Ford, Mr. Montgomery and Mr. Lockerman, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Anne-Arundel and Montgomery counties, praying an act may pass, empowering commissioners to alter and improve the roads leading from Elk-Ridge Landing, by the mill of Richard Owing, to the road leading from Snell's bridge to Ellicott's mills, and the road leading from said Owing's mill to the road leading from Green's bridge to Ellicott's mills, was preferred, read, and referred, with a counter petition thereto, to Mr. Contee, Mr. R. Wootton and Mr. Ridgely, of Wm. to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Rebecca Dulany, of Baltimore county, stating, that she had purchased a tract of land called Darby Hall, in the said county, which was laid out into lots and public lanes, and praying that an act may pass, empowering indifferent persons to alter two of the said lanes, at the intersection of which she had placed her buildings, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. M'Mechen, Mr. S. Wilmer and Mr. Sprigg, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore-town, stating, that by means of a large body of stagnant putrid water, on Pratt-street, and near the Hanover market, the health and general convenience of the inhabitants are greatly injured, and praying an act may pass, authorising commissioners to remove the above nuisance, and charge the property with the expences incurred thereby, and that some general powers may be vested for effectually removing nuisances, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. M'Mechen, Mr. Nelson and Mr. Ridgely, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Bowie, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act for valuing the lot or lots of ground in Upper-Marlborough, in Prince-George's county, on which the inspecting houses stand, and for paying the proprietor the value thereof; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On the second reading the bill further extending the exclusive privilege granted to Gabriel Peterfon Vanhorn and Robert Hodgson, by certain acts of this state, to keep and run stage carriages, the question was put, That the term of running said stage carriages be extended to the first day of February, seventeen hundred and ninety-seven? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, That the term be extended to the first day of February, seventeen hundred and ninety-six? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read throughout, the question was put, That the said bill do pass? Resolved in the affirmative.
