That it appears to your committee, certificates, agreeably to the act to adjust the debts due from this state, have been issued to sundry persons, to the amount of £. 2589 2 8½, and certificates, agreeably to an act for the liquidation and payment of debts against persons convicted of treason, and British subjects, and the supplementary acts thereto, paid to sundry claimants, amounting to £. 505 14 5.

That your committee have counted and burnt the sum of £. 24 7 0 of the bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly of the 8th of June, 1780, and the further sum of £. 150 0 0 of the bills of credit made by an act of congress of the 18th of March, 1780.

That your committee have also examined and cancelled certificates issued under the act of November session, 1782, to the amount of £. 2185 7 4, certificates for debts adjusted amounting to £. 4718 17 5, depreciation certificates to the amount of £. 2321 16 7, certificates for debts against persons convicted of treason, amounting to £. 1216 2 9, and the further sum of £. 1 8 0 journal certificates.

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of said treasurer, he hath paid away, from the 1st of November, 1792, to the 1st of November, 1793, the sum of £. 36,086 15 10½ specie, 453 dollars 14 cents funded six per cent. stock, 68,275 dollars 94 cents deferred stock, and 100,464 dollars 86 cents three per cent. stock; for all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts; and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 215,175 dollars 58 cents six per cent. stock, 26,354 dollars 17 cents deferred stock, 262,207 dollars 78 cents three per cent. stock, and £. 12,146 3 9½ specie; which sum of specie is appropriated in the manner following, viz.

That it appears to your committee there is the sum of £. 8850 0 0 in the treasury of the emission made by congress 18th March, 1780, it being part of the one tenth of the bills that became issuable in exchange for old continental money, and appropriated for the purpose of calling out of circulation the bills of credit emitted by acts of assembly and resolves of convention of this state. That your committee find, by the last report, there was the sum of £. 3472 8 1 in said bills remaining in the treasury, paid in on account of British creditors; that since that time the treasurer has paid away the sum of £. 150 0 0, for which payment have been produced to your committee the necessary voucher and receipt, and that there still remains in the treasury the sum of £. 3322 8 1.

Mr. Sprigg, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report: THE committee to whom was referred the petition of John Newell, of Kent county, have taken the same into consideration, and find, that the road prayed for has long been in use by tacit consent of the proprietors of the land, but never made a public one; that an agreement took place on the
