BY THE SENATE, NOVEMBER 20, 1793.

GENTLEMEN,

THE senate have passed a bill for the relief of Walter Smith, now in the goal of Montgomery county. It is hard that an unfortunate citizen, in actual and unmerited confinement, should wait the operations of a general act at the end of the session, and we therefore hope that your house will pass the bill now sent you. The person to be relieved by it appears to be worthy the interposition of the general assembly in his favour.
