No. 5, Contains a list of bonds taken for confiscated property which was formerly fold, and from

which the purchasers were released, and resold, amounting to £. 10,312 13.11.

No. 6, Is a list of bonds taken for confiscated property not heretofore sold, amounting to £. 7574

3 11, from which is deducted the sum of £. 1927 6 8, allowed to the several discoverers of the property, leaving a balance of £. 5646 17 3.
