Leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That Mr. Duvall, Mr. Purnell and

Mr. Crabb, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Goldsborough, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill; entitled; An act to amend, arrange, and consolidate into one law, the several testamentary laws of this state, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

ORDERED, That the faid bill be referred to the next fession of assembly.

Mr. O'Bryon, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, A Further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for marking and bounding lands; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill for the establishment of a market for the sale of live stock in or near to Baltimore-town; the bill to explain an act, entitled, An act for the valuation of real and personal property within this state, and the supplement to an act, entitled, An act to alter and amend the law in certain cases, and

to repeal the ninth and tenth sections of the said act, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

On the second reading the bill to regulate and repair the public roads in Cacil county, the question was put, That the following clause be received as an amendment to the said bill? " And be it enacted, That the justices of the levy court of Cæcil county shall be and they are hereby directed to apply two thirds of the money arising from the tax laid by virtue of this act on the property lying to the southward and eastward of Elk river, in said county, towards the making and repairing the roads to the fouthward and eastward of said river, in said county, under the same regulations as is herein before directed, any thing in this act to the contrary notwithstanding." Determined in the negative.

The bill being read throughout, the question was put, That the said bill do pass? The yeas and

nays being called for by Mr. Ward, appeared as follow:

Third page, after the end of the 13th line insert as follows: "And be it enacted. That the power of the commissioners appointed by this act, or to be appointed by virtue thereof, shall cease and determine on the first day of Japuary, in the year 1796." Strike out the last enacting clause.
