Mr. Johnson, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act for straightening and amending the road from the town of Cumberland, in Allegany county, which intersects the road leading from Union-town, in Pennsylvania, to the Winding-Ridge; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

RESOLVED, That Peter Hoffman, Thomas Beatty and Henry Griffith, junior, supervisors appointed by an act, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in Anne-Arundel, Baltimore and Frederick counties, be and they are hereby directed and required to lay before the next general assembly of this state, a full and fair account of all monies by them received by virtue of the afore-said act, also a full and fair account of all money by them respectively laid out and expended by virtue of said act, and by whom and for what use the same shall have been paid and expended.

The further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for marking and bounding lands, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

On the second reading the bill to erect Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, into a city, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, the question was put, That the following be proposed as an amendment to the said bill? viz. "Whereas it is represented to this general assembly, that the inhabitants of Deptford Hundred of Baltimore-town, are desirous of being left out of this act of incorporation, and exempted from the exercise or operation of any of its privileges and powers, further than the same may apply to them as part of Baltimore county, not included in the city or precincts; therefore, Be it enacted, That no privilege or power vested in this act or incorporation, shall be held, construed or taken, to be vested in or extend to the inhabitants of Deptford Hundred, other than as the same applies to the county, any thing in this act to the contrary notwithstanding." The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. M'Mechen, appeared as follow:
