Sixth page, 7th line from the top, strike out the word "white." 6th page, 14th line from the top, after the words "viva voce" strike out to the end of the clause. 10th page, 7th line from the top, after the word "to" strike out the words "make additions to the city and." 11th page, 3d line from the top, strike out the word "eighteen" and insert the word "sixteen." 13th page, 7th line from the bottom, strike out the words "general assembly or otherwise." 14th page, 2d line from the bottom, strike out the word "county" and insert "city, and the precincts thereof." 16th page, 4th line from the top, after the word "county" insert the following proviso: "Provided always, that the appointment of recorder, and his two associates, shall be approved of by the governor and council before they shall hold a court." 27th page, 6th line from the top, strike out from the word "altered" to the word "and" inclusive in the 8th line, and insert the word "with."
