The bill for the incorporation of Cokesbury college, at Abingdon, in Harford county, was read the ſecond time, and paſſed.

Mr. Goldfborough, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act relating to public roads in this ſtate, and to repeal the acts of aſſembly therein mentioned; which was read the firſt time and ordered to lie on the table.

ORDERED, That the ſaid bill have a ſecond reading on Tueſday next.

The bill for the incorporation of Cokesbury college, at Abingdon, in Harford county, the bill for the weighing of hay and cording of wood in Elkton, Cæcil county, the further ſupplement to an act, entitled, An act for the eſta bliſhment of ſelect veſtries, the bill relating to the clerks, ſheriffs and regiſters of wills, in the ſeveral counties therein named, the bill to empower Philip Reed to collect the balances due him as ſheriff and collector of Kent county, the bill to authoriſe the holding of a lottery for the eſta bliſhment of a ſchool in Cæcil county, the bill to allow a further time for collecting balances due to Jonathan Seney, former ſheriff and collector of Queen-Anne's county, and the bill to alter ſuch parts of the conſtitution and form of government which prevent perſons from being members of the legiſlature, electors of the ſenate, or to hold offices of profit and truſt, other than thoſe who ſhall take an oath, were ſent to the ſenate by the clerk.

On motion, the queſtion was put, That the houſe fit, for the diſpatch of public buſineſs, from nine o'clock in the morning till ſix o'clock in the evening? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. Sprigg, appeared as follow:
