Mr. Ridgely, of William, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery for the benefit of Hannah Sater, of Baltimore county; which was read the first and second time by especial order, and passed. Sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill to empower John Hanson, of John, to dispose of the real estate belonging to the children of Walter Hanson, of John, late of Charles county, deceased, was read the second time, and passed. Sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill to authorise and empower William M'Comas, and Hannah his wife, executors of Zacheus Onio, deceased, to sell the land therein mentioned, was read the second time by especial order, and passed. Sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill for the establishment and regulation of the levy courts in the several counties of this state, be committed for amendment.

Mr. Goldsborough, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a report on the petitions of sundry insolvent debtors; which was read.

On the second reading the report on the petition of John Cox, RESOLVED, That he is entitled to a compensation, provided the state is in possession of funds arising from the confiscated property of Daniel Dulany, son of Walter, adequate to that purpose.

On motion, the question was put, That the auditor be directed to settle and liquidate the account of the proceeds of sales of the confiscated property of Daniel Dulany, son of Walter, together with the claims against the same arising on mortgage, or heretofore allowed by the legislature? The yeas and nays being required by three members, appeared as follow:
