THE committee to whom was referred the petition of fundry inhabitants of Prince George's and Charles counties, praying a repeal of the act of April session, seventeen hundred and eightythree, entitled, An act to prohibit the bringing slaves into this state, and the several supplementary acts thereto, report, that they have examined the allegations suggested by the petitioners, and believe the constructions given said laws by the courts in this state have been different and contradictory. The committee think the construction of said laws and their meaning very doubtful, and ought to be explained by the legislature. The committee, opposed upon principles of policy to an entire repeal of faid laws, would beg leave to suggest to the house the propriety of making the laws explicit and clear on this subject, and that a bill be brought in to comprise, in one law, all the necessary provisions that this case requires. All which is submitted.

Mr. Baer, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, A Further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish a market in Frederick-town, in Frederick county, and for the regulation of the faid market; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.
