RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay unto Conrod Whiteman, or order, the sum of _____, it being for his services as a soldier in the fifth Maryland regiment from the fourteenth day of April, seventeen hundred and seventy-eight, to the thirteenth day of February, seventeen hundred and seventy-nine.

BY THE SENATE, NOVEMBER 20, 1795.

GENTLEMEN,

WE have dissented to your resolution in favour of Benjamin Rogers, but will have no objection to assent to a resolution similar to the one herewith sent.

RESOLVED, That the sum of twenty-two pounds three shillings and nine-pence in bills of credit emitted by an act of congress of the eighteenth of March, seventeen hundred and eighty, and deposited on the nineteenth of May, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, in the treasury, in lieu of eight hundred and eighty-seven pounds eight shillings and nine-pence currency, by Benjamin Rogers, on account of Thomas Bladen, under an act of assembly of this state passed at October session, seventeen hundred and eighty, chapter five, and still remaining in the treasury, be returned by the treasurer of the western shore to said Benjamin Rogers, or order, the said Rogers having otherways satisfied the claim of the said Bladen, as appears by the certificate of Daniel Dulany, his administrator.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill to prevent the removal of persons from this state who have petitioned, or may petition, for freedom, have a second reading on Wednesday next.

The bill to authorize the holding of a lottery for erecting a steeple to the Lutheran church in Frederick-town, in Frederick county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill to survey, continue and extend, certain streets therein mentioned, lying in the additions to George-town, in Montgomery county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Calvert county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The report on the petition of the rector and vestry of Saint-James's parish, was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That Mr. Pinkney, Mr. Hall and Mr. Ridgely, of William, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

RESOLVED, That the sum of £. 22 3 9 in bills of credit emitted by an act of congress of the 18th March, 1780, and deposited on the 19th of May, 1781, in the treasury, in lieu of £. 887 8 9 currency, by Benjamin Rogers, on account of Thomas Bladen, under an act of assembly of this state passed at October session, 1780, ch. 5, and still remaining in the treasury, be returned by the treasurer of the western shore to said Benjamin Rogers, or order, the said Rogers having otherways satisfied the claim of the said Bladen, as appears by the certificate of Daniel Dulany, his administrator.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government. ORDERED, That Mr. Whittington, Mr. Digges and Mr. Ridgely, of William, be a committee to prepare and bring the same.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a supplement to an act to regulate the militia of this state, passed November session, 1793. ORDERED, That Mr. Carroll, Mr. Steele, Mr. Lloyd, Mr. McMechen and Mr. Ridgely, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a supplement to an act for the regulation of officers fees. ORDERED, That Mr. Jarrett, Mr. Gale, Mr. Wootton, Mr. Parnham and Mr. J. Bond, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The amendments to the bill for the valuation of the lot of ground in Queen-Anne, in Prince-George's county, whereon the warehouses stand, and for paying the proprietor the value thereof, were read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill to authorize and empower the levy court of Dorchester county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time by especial order and passed.
