Amendments proposed. Strike out from the word " collector" in the 14th line of the first page  
to the end of the preamble, and insert " And this general assembly, for the reasons stated in said pe-  
tition, are willing to grant him some indulgence." After the word " fees" in the 3d line of the 2d  
page, insert " for the year seventeen hundred and ninety-four." At the end of the bill add the fol-  
lowing proviso: " Provided always, and be it enacted, That the said John C. Beatty, or some per-  
son or persons authorised by him, shall, at least ten days before execution or distress of property for  
the balances aforesaid, deliver to the person charged, or leave at his or her place of abode, a proved  
account, stating the taxes and the amount of fees, or such part thereof as may be claimed as due,  
together
