"That the state may, at any time, subscribe and become a stockholder to an amount not exceeding one million of dollars, including the two thousand shares of the original capital not by this act apportioned among the several counties, and for which the right of subscribing is hereby referved to the state, but shall not be permitted to pay, in the course of any one year, a sum exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, unless by express consent of the president and directors previously signified in writing to the state, or its agent authorised to subscribe." Determined in the negative.

On further progression in reading the said bill, the question was put, That the following article be ftruck out of the faid bill? "That half yearly dividends shall be made to the stockholders of so much of the profits of the bank as shall appear to the directors advisable, and once in every three years the directors shall lay before the stockholders, at a general meeting, for their information, an exact and particular statement of the debts which shall have remained unpaid after the expiration of the original credit, and of the furplus of credit, if any, after deducting losses and dividends, and if on striking the profit of every three years, the same shall exceed, upon an average, ten per centum per annum; the one half of the said excess shall be paid to the state, the residue to the stockholders."
