Sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Hollingsworth, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act further extending the time for making returns of certain certificates and plots; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for altering the time of holding the orphans court in Worcester county, endorsed; "By the senate, December 15, 1795: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

"By the senate, December 15, 1795: Read the second time by especial order and will pass. H. WARFIELD, clk.

"By order, H. WARFIELD, clk." The bill to empower Benjamin Preston to collect the balances due him, endorsed; "By the senate, December 15, 1795: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

"By order, H. WARFIELD, clk." "By the senate, December 15, 1795: Read the second time by especial order and will pass with the proposed amendments.

"By order, H. WARFIELD, clk." Amendments proposed. First page, 16th line, strike out the words "years seventeen hundred and ninety-two and seventeen hundred and ninety-three, and," and insert "year." 2d page, after the word "person" in the 9th line, insert "and the balance due thereon."

Which were read the first and second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. And the bill to enable the vestrymen of the parish of Saint-James, in Anne-Arundel county, for the time being, to sell a tract of land therein mentioned, and to apply the money arising by such sale towards the purchase of another tract or parcel of land, to be made a glebe for the use of the rector of that parish, and his successors, endorsed; "By the senate, December 12, 1795: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

"By order, H. WARFIELD, clk." "By the senate, December 15, 1795: Read the second time and will pass.

"By order, H. WARFIELD, clk." Ordered to be engrossed.

The resolution in favour of Benjamin Hatcheson, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from Edward Vidler and Anthony Jones, appointed in behalf of numerous mechanics, and others, stating, that they have served for several months the agents of Morris, Nicholson and Greenleaf, in the city of Washington, with various labour and materials, that they have not received compensation for their services, and praying redress, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Pinkney, Mr. Quynn and Mr. Reintzel, to consider and report thereon.

On the second reading the report on the petition of Edward Johnson, RESOLVED, That no proceedings shall be had against the representatives of William M'Laughlin, on his account with this state as sheriff or collector of Baltimore county, until the end of the next session of assembly.

Sent to the senate by the clerk. The report on the petition of John Walling, John Morgan and John Wayne, was read the second time and concurred with.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to appoint an agent for the year seventeen hundred and ninety-six. ORDERED, That Mr. Pinkney, Mr. Key, Mr. Dennis, Mr. Digges and Mr. Winchester, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion, ORDERED, That Mr. Pinkney, be added to the committee of conference respecting the establishment of the western limits of this state.

Mr. Carroll, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the militia of this state; which was read, and referred to the next session of assembly.

The report on the petition of the Patuxent associators, was read the second time, and the question put, That the house concur therewith? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
