

That it appears to your committee the said treasurer hath received from William Marbury, agent, for confiscated property, £. 6 16 8 interest on funded 6 per cent. stock, 21,776 dollars 17 cents funded 6 per cent. stock, 3,655 dollars 81 cents deferred 6 per cent. stock, £. 25 0 0 certificates for debts adjusted, £. 14 3 0 interest on said certificates, and £. 1206 10 7 specie. For bonds in the old loan-office 1358 dollars 84 cents funded 6 per cent. stock, and £. 295 1 1 specie. For bonds taken for open accounts 1062 dollars 26 cents funded 6 per cent. stock, and £. 314 11 2 specie, 114 dollars 22 cents deferred 6 per cent. stock, and £. 33 4 7 specie. For fines and forfeitures £. 1082 17 5 1/2 specie. For marriage licences £. 1388 14 5 1/2 specie. For ordinary and retailers licences £. 2977 18 4 specie. For taxes under the act for the better administration of justice £. 677 8 5 specie. And for naval duties the sum of £. 252 17 3 specie.

That it appears to your committee, certificates for the liquidation and payment of debts against persons convicted of treason and British subjects, and the supplementary acts thereto, paid sundry claimants, amounting to £. 14 0 0.

That your committee have examined and cancelled certificates for debts adjusted to the amount of £. 25 0 0, and certificates for debts against persons convicted of treason amounting to £. 67 3 2 1/2.

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of said treasurer, he hath paid the sum of £. 7841 2 11, agreeably to the resolutions of last session, in discharge of the emissions of June, 1780, and the certificates issued under the acts of assembly of this state, which emissions and certificates your committee have examined and cancelled. That it also appears the said treasurer hath paid away, from the first of November, 1796, to the first of November, 1797, 100,590 dollars 17 cents funded 6 per cent. stock, 558 dollars 60 cents funded 3 per cent. stock, 295 dollars 2 cents deferred 6 per cent. stock, and £. 50,442 6 11 specie; for all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts; and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 305,016 dollars 10 cents funded 6 per cent. stock, 259,371 dollars 19 cents funded 3 per cent. stock, 68,055 dollars 06 cents deferred 6 per cent. stock, and £. 32,169 11 5 specie; which sum of specie is appropriated in the manner following, viz.

That it appears to your committee there is the sum of £. 8850 0 0 in the treasury of the emissions made by an act of congress of the 18th of March, 1780, it being part of the one tenth of the bills that became issuable in exchange for old continental money, and appropriated for the purpose of calling in of circulation the bills of credit emitted by acts of assembly and resolves of convention of this state.

That your committee find, by the last report, there was the sum of £. 3300 4 4 in said bills remaining in the treasury, paid in on account of British creditors, which sums still remain in the treasury.

It also appears to your committee, that William Marbury, Esquire, agent, has, in virtue of an act entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, and deposited in the treasury, bonds to the amount of £. 879 13 10.

Your committee beg leave further to report, that by the resolutions of last session, time was given the first of July, 1797, to the holders of the emissions of June, 1780, and the certificates issued under the acts of assembly of this state, to bring them in for payment; it appears, as herein before stated, that the sum of £. 7841 2 11 only, has been brought in and discharged, and it appearing to your committee that there is the sum of £. 14068 5 8, in principal and interest, of said emissions still in circulation, and a considerable sum of certificates outstanding, the precise amount of which cannot at this time be ascertained; and it also appearing to your committee, that there is the sum of £. 9142 11 7 1/2 in the treasury, received on account of the funds appropriated for the redemption of said emissions and certificates; your committee therefore beg leave to suggest the propriety of passing a law limiting a time for the redemption of the said emissions and certificates.

All which is submitted to the honourable house.
