Amendments proposed. Strike out from the word "Whittington" in the fourth line to the word "under" in the sixth line, and insert, "in case the said John should die before his arrival to lawful age, and without issue, which said limitation took effect, and the title in the said tract of land became vested in the said Southy Littleton Whittington by the death of the said John during his minority, and without issue: And whereas it is represented, that the said Southy Littleton Whittington fled to the British during the late war, by reason whereof the said tract of land became liable to confiscation." Which were read the first and second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill to empower the levy court of Harford county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, endorsed; "By the senate, December 4, 1797: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
