The resolution in favour of John Threlkeld, the supplement to the act for building a new gaol in the town of Easton, in Talbot county, and to provide for the regulation of the said gaol, and the bill to alter, abolish and repeal, such parts of the second, third, fourteenth and forty-second sections of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the judges, time, place and manner, of holding the several elections therein specified, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from William King, of Prince-George's county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

A petition from Leonard Davis, of Saint-Mary's county, praying a return of money paid into the treasury as caution money on a warrant of resurvey, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Leigh, Mr. Parham and Mr. Page, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. J. C. Thomas, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Achsah Howard, executrix of Ephraim Howard, who was executor of Vachel Denton Howard, report, that they examined the facts therein stated, and submit the following resolution:

Whereas it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of Achsah Howard, executrix of Ephraim Howard, who was executor of Vachel Denton Howard, that the aforesaid Ephraim Howard, on the 20th day of March, 1781, did lodge with the treasurer of the western shore the sum of £. 37 10 of the emission of June, 1780, on account of a debt due from Vachel Howard and Charles Ridgely to John and Gilbert Buchanan, of London, merchants, in pursuance of an act of assembly passed at October session, 1780, and the said debt hath since been settled and paid, and therefore the said Achsah Howard, executrix as aforesaid, is entitled to the money paid as aforesaid into the treasury; therefore, RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be authorized, and he is hereby required, on the application of the said Achsah Howard, to return to her the aforesaid sum of £. 37 10 of emission of June, 1780, paid as aforesaid into the treasury by Ephraim Howard, on account of John and Gilbert Buchanan, of London, merchants.
