

The bill to authorise a lottery for repairing and completing the church and chapel in Shrewsbury parish, and for the sale of the glebe-lands belonging to the same, in Kent county, endorsed; "By the senate, December 11, 1797: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

In the 16th line of the same page strike out from the word "church" to the end of the clause.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The message and resolution respecting the revision of the laws of the state of Maryland, and the supplement to the act, entitled, An act to erect Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, into a city, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill to relinquish the right of this state to the lands therein mentioned, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill for the benefit of certain foreigners who emigrated and settled in this state before the act of naturalization, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Dorsey, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Thomas Cockey Deye, of Baltimore county, report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and find, by an act of April session, seventeen hundred and eighty-seven, Sarah Buchanan, executrix of Archibald Buchanan, deceased, Alexander Cowan, Thomas Sim Lee, Daniel of St. Thomas Jenifer and Benjamin Nicholson, were appointed trustees, and empowered to sell so much of the real estate of the said Archibald Buchanan as would be sufficient to satisfy the judgments obtained against him by the state of Maryland; that by virtue of said act, the said trustees, in the month of September, seventeen hundred and eighty-seven, did proceed to make
