The bill respecting the stealing and counterfeiting of checks or orders on banks, the bill for the valuation of real and personal property within this state, and the bill for the direction of sheriffs and coroners in the return of jurors, and for the better regulation of juries, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill declaring a certain road in Worcester county a public highway, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to empower Sarah Buchanan, executrix of Archibald Buchanan, deceased, Alexander Cowan, Thomas Sim Lee, Daniel of Saint Thomas Jenifer and Benjamin Nicholson, to sell and dispose of certain lands for the purposes herein after mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill to reimburse William Evans, of the city of Baltimore, certain monies advanced and expended by him in repairing certain roads in Baltimore and Anne-Arundel counties, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The report on the petition of Leonard Davis was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.
