Mr. Leigh, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to authorize and empower the levy court for Saint-Mary's county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill further to extend the powers of the levy court in the several counties of this state, was read the second time, and the question put, That the said bill do pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
