The following resolution being propounded to the house was read.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore of Maryland shall and he is hereby dis rected to pay to the mayor of the city of Baltimore, or to his order, out of any unappropriated money that may be in the treasury, the sum of ———— dollars, to be applied to the finishing the hospital for the relief of indigent fick persons and for the reception and care of lunatics between in Baltimora county, agreeably to an acc passed at the last session of the general accounty, upon bond being given, with good security, for the faithful and due application of the said sum of money to the purpose herein before mentioned. On the fecond reading the faid refolution, the quellion was put, That the blank be filled up with the fran of eight thousand dollars? Determined in the negative.

Onderen, That the further consideration of the faid resolution be postponed.

Mr. Duckett, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker the following reports THE committee to whom was referred the petition of William Ferguson, of Prince-George county, report, they have taken the fame into confideration; and find, that on the eighth day of September, feventeen hundred and eighty-three, the petitioner purchased of Clement Holliday, Eig; one of the commissioners for the sale of confiscated property, two tracks of land, called Waughton and Chance, which tracts were faid to contain and fold for the quantity of five hundred and feventuen acres of land, but the committee state, that Waughton, clear of elder fur. veys, only contains three hundred and ninety-fix and a half acres, and Chance is entirely included in more antient furveys. The committee further, find, that the faid William Fergulon paid the whole of the purchase money, with interest; that fince he discovered the deficiency in the land, he fold to John Laird, who fold to Thomas Dick, but that the faid Ferguson disclosed the fituation of the property, and expressly reserved his claim on the state. The committee served ther find, that the state of Maryland, having a title to twenty-eight and a quarter acres of land included in the lines of Waughton, but which were also comprehended in elder surveys, and being defrous of complying, as far as practicable, with the contract, conveyed the faid twentyeight and a quarter acres, together with that part of Waughton clear of elder surveys, to the faid Thomas Dick, the whole amounting to four hundred and twenty-four and three quarters of neres of land. The committee are of epinion that the faid William Ferguson has a just claim on the Hate for the value of the faid ninety-two and a quarter acres of land at the time of fale, withinterest thereon, in the same manner he has paid; they therefore submit the following resolutions:

Whereas it appears to this general affembly, that four tracts of land, called Haddock's Hills, Earbado, Seaman's Delight, and Yarrow Head, interfere with and take away ninety-two and one nuarcer of an acre of two tracts of land, called Waughton and Chance, conficated property, heretofore fold to William Ferguson, of Frince-George's county, by Clement Holliday, Esquire one of the commissioners for the fale and preservation of British property: And whereas the said Verguion has paid the state of Maryland the full amount of the purchase money, without receiving any deduction on account of faid deficiency: And whereas in justice the state is bound to refund and pay back to the faid William Ferguion the money he has paid for faid land taken away as aforefaid; for the dicertaining the true value thereof at the time of fale, with a view to the whole contract, Resolved, That the agent of the state be and he is hereby authorised, empowered and requested, with all convenient speed, to repair to the premises so purchased by the Taid. William Ferguson, first giving him ten days notice in writing of the time appointed by him for this purpose, and to will and appointed the lands so the la for this purpose, and to view and examine the lands so taken away, and to receive and consider fach evidence respecting the quality and situation thereof as may enable him, in aid of his own judgment thereupon, to afcertain the true relative value of the lands fo affected, having a regard to the original fale, and report the valuation thereof to the treasurer of the western shore, under

his hand and feal. AND RESOLVED, That the faid treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay the amount of fuel valuation, with legal interest thereon, to the said William Ferguson, or his order, in manner following, to wit: Two thirds of principal, and interest from the time of fale on the whole principal to the first day of December, seventeen hundred and ninety, in six per cent. Stock of the United States, and one third of the principal in deferred stock aforefaid, with the interest on the whole principal from the first day of December, seventeen hundred and ninety, until paid.
