The report on the petition of Andrew Buchanan was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That the committee appointed on the said petition prepare and bring in the same.

A petition from George and Patrick Magruder, counter to the petition of Townsend W. Hunt, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petitions of insolvent debtors.

Mr. Key, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the agent's report have considered the same with attention, and examined the respective items with the credits in the account of the treasurer, as stated by the committee of claims, and after a full examination of the subject, with the accompanying vouchers, they report, that the statement of the agent is true and correct. As it has been usual for several years past for this committee to report the actual and accruing funds of the state, they here subjoin such a statement, shewing, at one view, the actual existing funds, the contingent or annual revenue, and the appropriations on it, including the standing expences of the ensuing year.
