On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to authorife the transcribing of such records as are in a decayed state in the register of wills office for Kent county. ORDERED, That Mr. Barroll, Mr. Tilghman and Mr. Dunn, be a committee to prepare and bring in the fame.

Mr. J. Magruder, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to prevent the going at large of geese and swine in the town of Upper-Marlborough, in Prince-George's county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to empower Hardage Lane, of Montgomery county, occasionally to remove his slaves from the state of Virginia to this state, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate

by the clerk.

The house, according to order, resolved itself into a committee of the whole house on the billfor amending, and reducing into fystem, the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons.
