

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, November, 1798.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill to make permanent and to continue the acts of assembly therein mentioned, have a second reading on Thursday next.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to prevent assignees from suing by bill of privilege or attachment of privilege. ORDERED, That Mr. Jones, Mr. E. K. Wilson and Mr. Duckett, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The amendments to the bill authorizing the laying out a road in Worcester county, and the amendment to the bill to authorize the levy court of Prince-George's county to assess and levy a sum of money as an additional compensation for John Thomas Boucher, one of the assessors of said county, were read the second time, agreed to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
