the 1st and 2d clauses: "And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of every person who shall impound any swine in virtue of this law, to cause the marks and description of such swine to be advertised in the George-town news-paper for at least seven days, and if the same are not reclaimed by that time, and the expences of advertising, impounding and keeping them, paid, that the same shall be publicly sold, giving seven days notice of the time and place, and the proceeds of such sale shall be first applied to the expence of advertising, impounding and keeping them, and the surplus to the owner of said swine, if demanded within sixty days after the sale, and if not demanded within that time, then such surplus to be paid to the trustees of the poor-house for Montgomery county."

On the second reading of the bill for the encouragement of learning in the several counties in this state, and to establish an uniform system of education, the question was put, That the following clauses be received as an amendment to the said bill? "And be it enacted, That two thousand dollars be withdrawn from the funds granted to Washington college on the eastern shore after the first day of May next, and the same shall be paid into the treasury of the western shore, and shall be considered as set apart for the encouragement of learning in this state.

"And be it enacted, That the sum to be drawn by the visitors and governors of Washington college, after the first day of May next, shall be thirteen hundred dollars and a third of a dollar, to be paid them in the same manner as heretofore."

So it was resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read throughout, the question was put, That the following clause be added to the said bill? "And be it enacted, That the funds so withdrawn from Washington college shall be appropriated to the following uses, viz. The visitors and governors of the respective county schools on the eastern shore shall be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to draw on the treasurer of the western shore semi-annually for the following sums, viz. Cecil county two hundred and seventy dollars, Queen-Anne's county three hundred dollars, Caroline county two hundred and twenty dollars, Talbot county two hundred and fifty dollars, Somerset county three hundred dollars, Dorchester county three hundred and twenty dollars, Worcester county three hundred dollars, and the said sums, when by them received, shall be applied by the consent and with the approbation of a majority of the visitors and directors in each county in the following manner, for the purpose of promoting useful knowledge and education; that is to say, the said visitors and directors shall pay to able school-masters of good moral character, in different parts of their respective counties, a sum not under ten nor exceeding fifty dollars each, in any one year, and each school-master, for every ten dollars by him received, shall in each year teach and educate two poor boys, which boys shall be specified and named to him in writing by a majority of the visitors and directors."
