haps more than any other American, opportunities of weighing the probable effects of the fpaims, convultions and agonies, of a great nation, broke loofe from all restraint, in the centre of Eu-rope, I thought it might be as difficult for me as for any other to excuse myself from the trial. The affectionate and ardent support which I have received from my fellow-citizens, has appeared much earlier, and more unanimous, than my most fanguine hopes had ever anticipated. In the generous and general declarations of satisfaction and approbation of my fellow-citizens, in all parts of the union, I have received a reward which I esteem above all other personal confideration in this life. Nothing of the kind has excited my gratitude more fincerely than this magnanimous address from the general assembly of Maryland. Most cordially I wish you all health and happiness.
