Amendments proposed. At the end of the first enacting clause insert the following: "Provided always, and be it enacted, That the said gaol shall be erected and built on a lot of ground on the east side of Jones's Falls, and not at a greater distance from the court-house in said county than a lot owned by William Wilson on said falls, and if the said ground cannot be procured on the said falls, that then and in that case the commissioners aforesaid are hereby directed to build the said gaol as directed in the original act to which this is a supplement." In the first line of the second enacting clause, after the word "enacted" insert "that if a lot of ground on Jones's Falls can be procured for building thereon the gaol aforesaid within the distance aforesaid." In the same line, after the word "that" insert "then and not before." In the first line of the second page strike out the words "two hundred and sixty-three feet to a post standing one hundred feet," and insert the words "two hundred and ten feet to a point one hundred and fifty-three feet."

Mr. Edmondson, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act relating to the records in the register of wills office in Talbot county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to prevent the going at large of geese and swine in the towns of Upper-Marlbrough and Nottingham, in Prince-George's county, endorsed; "By the senate, December 29, 1798: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table."
