On motion, ORDERED, That the bill for amending, and reducing into system, the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, have a second reading on to-morrow.

On the second reading of the amendments to the bill for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, the question was put, That the house agree to the twelfth amendment? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

The bill to make permanent and to continue the acts of assembly therein mentioned, was sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from Ralph Ormiston, of Washington county, praying his title to certain lands may be confirmed, he being an alien at the time of his purchasing the same, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Kerfner, Mr. Geoghegan and Mr. Lemmon, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Henry Wine Miller, of Frederick county, praying an exclusive right of running stages from Frederick-town to George-town, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Thomas, Mr. Gwinn and Mr. E. K. Wilson, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Thomas Gassaway, of Allegany county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

On motion, ORDERED, That the message of the senate respecting the bank stock be referred to the committee appointed to prepare a message to the senate upon the subject of reconsideration of the resolution relative to the said bank stock.

The report on the petition of a number of inhabitants of Cæcil county was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That the committee appointed on the said petition prepare and bring in the same.

The report on the petition of Richard J. Orme was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill relating to the records in the register of wills office in Talbot county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the supplement to the bill to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, have a second reading on Monday next.
